Our Methodology

We utilise a three-step approach to empower individuals and enhance employability:

- 1. **ADAPT* and WASP**:** Utilizing these tools to assess and develop work skills, ensuring participants have a solid foundation.
- 2. **Timed Exam:** Requiring a 70% or higher score to progress to vocational training funding ensures participants are adequately prepared.
- 3. **Vocational Training Funding:** By linking funding to demonstrated competence, we're investing in participants who are more likely to succeed.

Benefits

Our approach leads to:

- Better Job Readiness: Participants will have the skills and knowledge to progress in the labour market.
- Increased Employability: By focusing on work skills and vocational training, participants will be more attractive to potential employers.
- Efficient Use of Resources: By assessing participants' skills and knowledge before providing funding, we're reducing the risk of investing in those who may not be ready for vocational training.

Outcomes

By setting a clear benchmark (70% or higher), we're ensuring that participants are well-prepared for vocational training and future employment. This approach can lead to better outcomes for both the participants and the organisations investing in their development.
